

Summer Pipeline Program for Medical Students

June 12, 2023 – August 4, 2023

The Summer Pipeline Program is an eight-week research program at MSK offered to students from underrepresented groups in medicine who have completed their first or second year at an accredited US medical school and have an interest in pursuing a career as a physician-scientist in the field of oncology or related biomedical sciences. The AAMC defines underrepresented in medicine as those racial and ethnic populations that are underrepresented in the medical profession relative to their numbers in the general population.

Students in this program get valuable clinical or laboratory research experience under the mentorship of MSK faculty, attend educational lectures presented by world-renowned MSK faculty as well as skill-building workshops, and present their research to peers and MSK faculty at the end of the program.

Through the support of MSK's Office of Health Equity, participants receive a \$7,000 stipend for the eight-week program. Housing and transportation are not included.

Eligibility

First- or second-year medical students in good academic standing at US medical schools accredited by the LCME or COCA.

Must be free of all other academic commitments during the eight-week program.



The Application

The 2023 application will open on **December 19, 2022** at sam.mskcc.org/pipeline.

Fill out the application and submit a letter from your medical school dean or registrar stating that you are in good academic standing. Non-US citizens must also provide a personal statement and current CV.

Decision

All applicants will be notified of a decision via email by **March 1, 2023**. You must confirm your spot within three days of the acceptance notification. Decisions are granted on a rolling basis.
